

Y1 Knowledge Organiser – Chalkboards and Chimney Sweeps

Key Vocabulary

Chalkboard - A dark coloured board you can write on with chalk.

Chimney Sweep - A person whose job is cleaning out the soot from Chimneys

Servant/Maid - A person who works in other people's houses doing jobs.

Workhouse – A building where the poorest of people work.

Gruel - A thin liquid food of oats boiled in milk or water.

Carriage – A horse drawn vehicle.

Reign – A period of time a King or Queen rules.

Material – What things are made out of such as wood, metal, plastic etc.

Transparent – Light completely passes through it. You can clearly see through it.

Translucent – Some light passes through it but you can't see clearly through it.

Opaque – Does not allow light to pass through it. You cannot see through it.

Physical Features – Anything that is on the Earth naturally.

Human Features – Things that have been made by humans.

Key (Map) – Symbols, colours or lines used to represent important places on a map.
