PAPIER MACHE MASK The Ancient Greeks had a huge tradition of theatre, often creating masks to appear as different characters. Create and decorate your own papier mache mask as whatever character you want! (Tip- use a balloon as the base)	GODS AND GODDESSES TOP TRUMPS Research the Ancient Greek Gods and Goddesses (they had lots!) and create a set of Top Trumps cards based on their special skills and abilities.	THE ODYSSEY/ HERCULES COMIC STRIP Find out all about Odysseus' quest, or Hercules' tasks. Create a comic strip to retell one of these.
CREATE A MODEL OF AN ANCIENT GREEK BUILDING The Ancient Greeks had a very distinctive style of architecture, often involving decorative columns. Using whatever material you like, create your own building (Top tip- look at the Parthenon for inspiration)	WRITE A TRAVEL BROCHURE FOR GREECE Travel brochures are very persuasive, using all the best features of a place to sell it to tourists. Write your own travel brochure/ leaflet or Powerpoint/ Keynote presentation to encourage people to visit modern day Greece.	GREEK MONSTER STORY Are all Greek monsters bad? Write a story or diary entry from the perspective of a Greek monster. e.g The Minotaur, trapped in a maze with no one to speak to, or Medusa, who is cursed so everyone she looks at turns to stone.
USE TECHNOLOGY TO RETELL A MYTH Whether you create a powerpoint, animation, podcast, live movie or even recreate a scene using Minecraft, retell a Greek myth using some form of technology!	CLAY POTS The Ancient Greeks used clay to create pottery, especially in the famous orange and black style. Can you find out how to create a pot, make your own and even decorate it in an Ancient Greek style?	SURPRISE ME! Do you have your own idea about something linked to our 'Eureka!' topic that you'd like to create or find out about? Then surprise me with your own idea! Make sure it's as challenging as the rest of our tasks.
