Climate	The general weather conditions that are typical of the location.	I can identify human and physical features that make Greece unique and created city states.	
Democracy	A fair political system where all adults vote for an elected government.	I can use sources to make comparisons between life in the city states of Athens and Sparta.	
Empire	A number of individual nations that are all controlled by the government or ruler of one particular country	I can understand the difference between democracy and dictatorship and compare democracy in Athens to oligarchy in Athens.	
Mythology	A group of myths, especially all the myths from a particular country, religion, or culture.	I can explore the impact Greek politics has had on our world today.	
Philosophy	The study or creation of theories about basic things such as the nature of existence, knowledge, and thought, or about how people should live.	I can use sources to explore the Battle of Marathon, Persian invasion, Battle of Thermopylae and why they were significant events.	
Polis	An ancient Greek city-state polytheists the worship of or belief in more than one god	I can explore Greek philosophers and Alexander The Great.	
Settlement	A locality or populated place is a community in which people live	I can understand what impact the Olympic games had on the modern world	
Acropolis	Fortified city core located on a rocky outcrop above Athens.		
Mount Olympus	The highest mountain in Greece and the mythological home of the Greek Gods, primarily twelve Olympian Gods.		
Parthenon	Temple dedicated to Athena located on the Athenian Acropolis.		
Titans	An older generation of Gods including Cronus & Rhea who were the children of earlier Gods and parents to the Olympian Gods (who later overthrew them).		
Chronology	Arrangement of events or dates in order of occurrence.		
Citizen	An inhabitant of a particular town or city.		
Agora	A public open space used for assemblies and markets.
