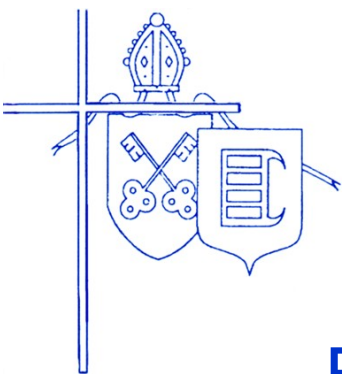




# Barnwood Church of England Primary School

## Remote Learning Offer

### School Vision

For Barnwood to be a school where we **'Love our neighbour'** and work together to **'be the best that we can be'** for the good of all.

Working with all members of our school community we want to provide our children with the best possible learning experiences so that they grow into ambitious and responsible citizens.

### Introduction

We are committed to providing high quality remote education for all of our children during this time and we want to support all of our children to move forward with their learning and not lose the educational gains they have made in school.

We will implement remote learning from your child's second day of absence linked to a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the household or after being instructed to self-isolate..

The Oak Academy online lessons and White Rose Maths can be used straight away at home for remote learning for every year group from day one of an absence linked to COVID-19.

Oak Academy covers a wide range of age related curriculum objectives and is a valuable resource that is freely accessible to each of our school families.

There are two general scenarios for remote learning outlined in the table on the next page.

- the first scenario where only your child(ren) is not permitted to attend school due to COVID-19
- the second scenario outlines the actions in the case of a whole bubble not being permitted to attend school or in the case of a partial school closure

This may be the screens from the lesson being uploaded onto the class website page/TEAMS/sent by class email along with resources / worksheets if appropriate and if the resources required for the lessons are readily accessible. If the lessons being taught in class are not able to be delivered remotely (for example if the lesson requires additional resources such as art resources e.g. clay or pastels, or geography resources e.g. maps and atlases) then alternative 'topic' learning will be set on the class website page/TEAMS/sent by class email which may make further use of the Government's 'Oak Academy' lessons.</li> </ul>                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                  |

This may be a combination of White Rose Maths videos (the scheme used in school), the powerpoints/screens shared in the classroom and resources/worksheets used in the classroom. Answers will initially be provided for self-marking at home.</li> <li>• <b>English tasks</b> uploaded to the class website page/TEAMS/sent by class email following the sequence of learning that was happening in the classroom. The quantity will be dependent on age/stage of your child. Some/all of these can be returned to your child's class teacher for monitoring. This will include spelling, grammar, writing and reading.</li> <li>• <b>Small group video learning</b> which will look different depending on the age of the children. This may be reading, maths sessions or writing sessions delivered by the class teacher*. The sessions will run during school hours for some invited small groups. The frequency of when your child's sessions will occur will be communicated by your child's class teacher via the class website page or class email. Any 'live' sessions will be set up through Microsoft 365 Teams and further information will be provided by the class teacher.</li> <li>• <b>Wider Curriculum learning(s)</b> will be uploaded to the class website page/TEAMS/sent by class email for children to complete and send back virtually. This will be lessons your child would have had in class this term which can be most easily adapted to remote learning.</li> <li>• <b>1:1 support</b> if your child receives 1:1 support through an EHCP and they are not in school or isolating, a more bespoke programme of support will be set up. This may include phone calls / video chats with your child's 1:1 support. They will usually be expected to still try to complete the learning set on the class website page/sent by class email.</li> </ul> |

\*any video learning sessions will not be facilitated by your child's class teacher if the teacher is the one experiencing Covid symptoms and the reason for the bubble closure. We know our parents will understand that the health and wellbeing of our children, families and staff is paramount.

## Suggested Timetable

We are acutely aware that for many of our families supporting primary aged children with their remote education presents a real challenge, especially if you are juggling working from home or have several children all needing to use the devices at the same time. Secondary aged children are much better placed to be able to access remote learning independently, join live lessons and interact more effectively.

It is for these reasons that we have tried to make our provision as flexible as possible so that you can move the timetable and tasks around in a way that works best for your own family situation. We are also mindful that live sessions for different year groups could overlap so we have made the decision to offer a live class drop in session each day.

Once our Teams platform is fully functional, children will be able to join a live class session towards the end of each school day. If they are able to join this session they will have the opportunity to see their class friends, ask any questions about their work, receive feedback, have misconceptions addressed, listen to the teacher read the class text and hear what the work for the next day will be. Please don't worry if your child(ren) can't join the live session every day as we know families with several children may need to create a rota for the attendance at these sessions across the week.

Below is a suggested timetable for a remote learning day. Classes will follow this in school but if you need to swap tasks around at home that is absolutely fine too.

To keep our approach consistent across the school class teachers will be available for work from 8.40am to 3.20pm. In a morning they will respond to emails sent the previous day and monitor any returned work and levels of engagement with remote learning. We completely understand that for many families, where parents and carers are also working from home, emailing in the evening will be your preferred option. This is why class teachers will have time each morning to access emails. Class teachers will then have time in a morning to plan and resource the work for the following day. Teachers will make sure the work is shared with parents and carers by the end of the school day so you have it in advance and can look at it with your child(ren).

Class teachers will be supervising the children onsite in the afternoon, as the majority of our Learning Partners do not work afternoons.

If children finish the remote learning set by their teachers during a school day children should use the time to practice their handwriting, number bonds and timestables and read a good book. There are also lots of useful links on our school website for games and quizzes that will be good fun to try if children have finished everything set for the day and still want more. It may also be a good idea to leave some resources to hand for your child(ren) in case they finish and you are busy on a call (perhaps some construction toys like lego, jigsaw puzzles, suduko, quiz books, art and craft tasks, mindful colouring etc. but please try to avoid time on their consoles as they will already have had a significant amount of screen time).
