WOW Experiences and Events...

Tricky Vocabulary to learn	
Winter	A time of the year following autumn and before spring where the weather is at it's coldest. The days are shorter and there is less daylight.
Season	The year is split into four seasons, winter is one.
Bare	When plants are 'empty' there is nothing left as the fruit and / or leaves have all dropped off.
Deciduous	Plants or trees that lose their leaves in Autumn/ Winter
Evergreen	Trees or plants that have green (often shiny) leaves which stay all year round.
Conifer	A evergreen tree with dark green spiked 'needle' leaves like a Christmas tree.
Months	December, January and February are the winter months of the year.
Holly	An evergreen tree with spikey green leaves and bright red berries.
Robin	A small garden bird with a bright red chest associated with autumn and winter.
Blackbird	A black garden bird with a bright yellow beak (male)
Fog	Very low cloud that means you cannot see far in front of you.
Frost	Happens when the temperature is around freezing - the outdoors looks white.
Hail	Frozen rain that falls often in a storm (not always in cold weather)
Snow	Slightly frozen rain falling in soft white flakes covering the ground.
Flood	When it rains too much and the ground is already full, there is nowhere for it all to go causing large pools of water on the ground surface.
Freezing/Frozen	Water freezes when the temperature is very, very, cold 0. Things can freeze outside during winter.

I can record observations using photographs or videos.

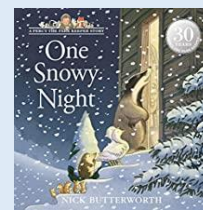
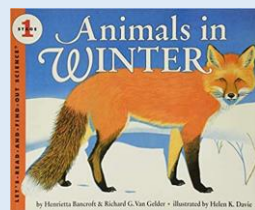
I can observe closely, perhaps using magnifying glasses.
